Presidents' Award - Ryan Wells

Ryan is a 14-year swimmer and 11-year diver with the Camelot Knights. He's also a diving coach, Senior Boy pool record holder for diving, Synchro bronze medalist, and eight-time diving All-Star. Ryan was captain of the Thomas Jefferson High School swim and dive team and placed top 10 in diving in the state in 2025. Outside of school, Ryan contributed to his community as an Eagle Scout, leading a project to mitigate storm drainage pollution in Fairfax County and working over 200 volunteer hours on projects for his pool and community. His other interests include German culture and language, and building and racing Formula4 racing karts. Ryan will attend Case Western Reserve University, majoring in engineering and diving for their varsity team.

She has enjoyed leading and participating in team traditions such as "dolphining" the yards of swimmers the night before big meets and tucking in the youngest swimmers the night before Divisionals. Kate swam for NCAP and was a two-year captain of the Marshall High School swim team. She has contributed to her community by founding The Swimsuit Drive to collect and provide appropriate swim gear for underprivileged children, and leading the Gardening Gurus Club at Marshall High School to remove invasive species and plant a rain garden. Kate was also editor-in-chief of the yearbook for three years, helping her school achieve the National Scholastic Press Association All-American Award in 2023 and 2024, and VHSL State Finalist status and Varsity Yearbook Top1% Award. Kate will attend The University of Virginia this fall.

Norah also swam for NCAP and was selected to be a coach in 2023. At West Potomac High School, she was captain of the swim team for two years, president of the National Honor Society for two years, and president of The Disinformation Project for three years. Norah will attend The University of Georgia, majoring in elementary education.

She swam for NCAP all through high school and was captain of the Lake Braddock High School swim team, where she qualified to State Championships all four years. She also held several leadership roles in DECA, was a representative on her school's Athletic Council, and volunteered with Splash into Safety to raise money to provide swim instruction to underserved communities.
